## By Public Transport

### From major airports

From any of London's airports, a pre-booked car will cost much less than a taxi. For Gatwick and Heathrow airports, train services provide alternatives to using a car, depending on personal preference. Luton, London City and Stansted airports have less satisfactory public transport links to Cambridge.

**Gatwick:** Buy a ticket to Cambridge, specifying that you wish to use the Gatwick Express. Take the Gatwick Express (departs every 15 mins; alternative services are not recommended); Victoria line tube northbound to Kings Cross St Pancras; train to Cambridge. Typical journey times 105 to 140 minutes.

Travel by car takes 100 to 180 minutes.

**Heathrow:** Take the Heathrow Express (departs every 15 mins; alternative tube service is slower). Buy a ticket to King's Cross before boarding if you have time to do so. On arrival at Paddington, ascend the stairs half way along the platform and turn right, then left to the Hammersmith and City line tube. Take an eastbound train to Kings Cross St Pancras where you must buy a ticket to Cambridge before continuing your journey. Typical journey times 90 to 120 minutes.

Travel by car takes 75 to 150 minutes.

**Stansted:** Travel by car takes approximately 45 minutes.

Public transport: usually two trains per hour, journey time 36 to 64 mins. This service has a poor record of reliability and you should leave a large margin for error when travelling to the airport. Hourly buses also run.

**Luton:** Travel by car takes approximately 60 minutes.

Public transport: hourly buses taking 1 hour 25 minutes to Cambridge city centre, then continue by local bus or taxi.

**London City:** Travel by car takes 70 to 90 minutes.

Public transport: shuttle buses run to London Liverpool St where there direct trains to Cambridge, or several routings are possible by Docklands Light

### By train from London

The quickest route to Cambridge from Central London is by train from King's Cross station. The Cambridge Cruiser non-stop service operates every 30 mins (H+15, H+45) on weekdays from London Kings Cross, taking 45 mins. Allow 15-20 mins for a taxi from the railway station, or take the free shuttle bus to the main bus station and continue by Bus.

### By bus from Cambridge city centre

The Citi5 bus departs St Andrew's Street Stop N outside Robert Sayle department store in the City Centre every 30 mins (H, H+30) and takes 15 mins to Chesterton High Street. Walk down Church Street which turns into St Andrew's Road.

Please note that we are in St Andrew's Road, which is not the same as St Andrew's Street in Cambridge city centre.
